Overview of Cardiff Met University Football Club

Cardiff Met University is one of the only institutions in the country that supports elite semi-professional football for both Men & Women. Our teams compete in the top University (BUCS) leagues and also in the Cymru and Adran premier respectively.

Success is in our DNA, with notable achievements including:

- The first University to ever reach the Europa League Qualification stages and the UEFA Women's Champions League Qualifiers.
- Have been crowned British University Champion's twice.
- Winners of the Women's Welsh Premier League on 5 occasions.

Players that have come through our system in recent years include:

- Sophie Ingle (Wales Captain and Champions League Winner with Chelsea FC)
- Will Evans (Newport County)
- Adam Roscrow (AFC Wimbledon)

In addition, the club has been awarded Category A status for its Junior Academy (U8 - U19), making it one of only 4 in Wales.

To continue to grow and develop the football system, we recently completed a transfer of the football club from its original student roots, into the University and formed CMUFC Ltd. The club now operates as a subsidiary, benefitting from wider institutional support. This new entity will have at its heart a balanced, diverse, inclusive and skilled Board. The first step in this process is to appoint an independent Chair. We will then also recruit for a further 6-8 members based on the needs and requirements of the football club.



Strategic Objectives

Cardiff Met Football Club strives to ensure strategic alignment between Cardiff Metropolitan University and the Football Association of Wales. The recent creation of a Five-Year Development Plan outlines the Club's commitment to the domestic pillars of Welsh Football, whilst recognising our position within the wider University. The Football Club operates out of Cardiff Met Sport, the sport, physical activity and health delivery arm of the University. Met Sport has the following strategic drivers:

Mission

We will deliver an outstanding, inclusive sporting experience and Cardiff Met will be regarded as Wales' Sporting University, capitalising on sport as a lever for wider social, economic and social good.

Approach

We will take a whole system approach across the University and the City of Cardiff. This means bringing together a wide range of partners; taking coordinated action across key areas; and focusing on system levers, where a small shift can create large changes. We will invest in and develop our research and evaluation capabilities to underpin this approach and ensure continued learning across the organisation.

We do this by working across 9 outcome areas:

People - We will continually develop an environment where one group of talented people can do the best work of their lives. This will include a focus on providing opportunities for our students through Open Campus and developing our coaching and volunteer workforce.

Places - We will develop and invest in our facility infrastructure to create accessible spaces that inspire movement and performance

Profile - We will establish our identity as Wales' Sporting University built on our community and performance programmes, underpinned by the iconic Archer story.

Pounds - We will focus on maximising the profitability of our existing programmes and explore the creation of new revenue streams that provide a sustainable and aligned return on investment.

Move More - We will lead the development of the Move More strategy adopting a place based approach, working with partners to make Cardiff the most active City in the UK.

Participation & Inclusion - We will improve the experience of our workforce, students and communities by providing equitable opportunities, improving participation levels and enabling all to feel included. Positioning equality, diversity and inclusion as everyone's business.

Play - We will develop and modernise our club structures. Providing an outstanding, inclusive student experience, whilst using the power of our sport clubs to support our wider sporting offer and sense of institutional belonging.

Performance - We will deliver transformational improvements in our performance programmes through structural change and significant investment driving sustained success on the National & International stage.

Planet - We will evolve existing practices and work with partners to drive forward sustainability initiatives that have a positive impact on achieving a low-carbon future.

Process - We will re-align the delivery model for sport and utilise data to sustain existing and improve outcomes from participation to performance.



Chair Role

At Cardiff Met University, our strategic ambition is to be Wales' Sporting University. This is an exciting opportunity for an experienced individual to become part of our unique sporting eco-system helping to build on our track record of success across both Men's and Women's football.

Due to the unique nature of the football club and its place within the University, this role will be primarily focussed on providing expert guidance and advice, to ensure we are maximising all avenues of development (commercial, digital, community, performance) across the football system. We are seeking an inspiring individual who is passionate about Higher Education and the unique role sport plays in the education, development and learning of young people. The role will act as a figure-head for Cardiff Met Football Club and will represent the University nationally as a member of the FAW.

Working with the Director of Football System, the role of the Board is to provide effective support and guidance focussing on the commercial development, partnerships, stakeholder relationships and legal requirements that will enable CMUFC to be successful. The Chair will ensure that:

- Using their own experience and working with the board they explore
 options that include the ability to diversify revenue streams, including
 funding and commercial opportunities with partners and sponsors, whilst
 ensuring the club has excellent stakeholder management and relationships.
- They provide expert advice and guidance ensuring the highest standards of corporate governance and equity are maintained, and all legal and regulatory requirements are complied with.
- There is effective communication among Board members the football development team and Director of Football System.



Chair Role cont.

Management of Meetings

To chair up to five meetings per annum, including the Annual General Meeting.

Leadership and Governance

Leadership of the football system is provided through Cardiff Met Sport and the Director of Football System. The Chair will act as counsel, providing advice and guidance that supports the strategic direction and priorities.

Candidates should be aware that the club resides within the University and therefore, the board does not have autonomy to make strategic decisions that do not align with corporate policy.

Develop and Encourage Board Members

Taking the lead in inducting and developing Board members, with a view to enhancing the Board's overall effectiveness as a team and assisting with succession planning.

Promote Equity and Equality

To enable equity in practice and strive for equality for all members, staff, and board members. To ensure the Board has and takes responsibility for the alignment with University policy on equality, equity, diversity and inclusion.

Ambassador Role

Acts as an ambassador for CMUFC externally and help build its brand and public image, ensuring an effective local and regional profile in consultation with the Director of Football System. Represents CMUFC as required with key stakeholders, such as the FAW, Sport Wales, Welsh Government or other influential decision-makers. Attends ad-hoc meetings as required (for example stakeholder meetings) to promote the values and purpose of CMUFC.



Person Specification

Essential

- Evidence of success, in a, Charity, Corporate, Health, Housing, Education, Equalities or Professional Services environment.
- Awareness and understanding of the Welsh and UK Football system.
- Experience on other Boards.
- Considerable commercial experience and ability to utilise knowledge and networks to support the development of the football club.
- Evidence of the ability to act with professionalism and probity, and with a strong philosophy of equity, inclusion, and diversity.
- Legal and corporate governance experience.

Desirable

- An understanding of the Welsh sporting sector and the challenges facing sports organisations at a domestic and/or international level.
- Specific legal experience.
- An understanding of the Higher Education sector.
- The ability to effectively communicate through the medium of Welsh.

Remuneration

The Chair role is voluntary with all reasonable expenses incurred during the fulfilment of duty will be re-imbursed in line with University policy.

Time Commitment

Chairing Board Meetings and representing the club externally as required.

Term

The term of office is 3 years with a second term (of 2 years) subject to board approval.
