Core purpose of role

The Physiotherapy Team is an integral part of the Performance Services Team, working across the university's performance programmes to deliver the highest quality support with the aim of ensuring the very best student-athlete experience. In addition to the practical and professional knowledge that is required to implement an efficient and effective physiotherapy service, the candidate will need to be able to engage with our student-athletes to provide them with every opportunity to attain their individual potential. To excel in this role the candidate will need to adopt a flexible approach to engage with coaches and other support staff in a multi-sport environment.

Key responsibilities and contributions

- Lead the planning, administration and delivery of a robust physio provision for the Cardiff Met RFC Men's Performance Programme, including a range of services but not limited to;
- Triage, matchday cover, clinic delivery, prehab, injury management, strapping & taping and education sessions.
- Work closely with the Director of Rugby and Head Coaches to understand and meet the needs of the relevant programmes.
- With guidance and support from the Head of Physiotherapy and Lead Rugby Physiotherapist, follow processes, standards, and procedures of the Physiotherapy Team and University GDPR.
- Work closely with the Coaching Team, Strength & Conditioning Team and other support services to contribute to a multi-disciplinary team approach.
- Work closely with identified placement students to integrate them into service delivery and enhance provision.
- Work within the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy, Health Care Professional Council and the University's Codes of Conduct; to ensure all documentation and communication is managed in accordance with the industry standard.
- Appropriately follow risk assessments, NOPs and other appropriate procedures for physio provision.
- Support the Head of Physiotherapy and Lead Rugby Physiotherapist with ideas and feedback to enhance and expand the physio provision to meet performance and wider objectives.
- Stay up to date with the latest trends and CPD opportunities in the physiotherapy field, engaging with both internal and external opportunities.

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- To carry out any other duties as appropriate in line with the grade of the role that may be requested by the Head of Physiotherapy.
- Act as a brand champion for the university by living our values and behaviours, and ensuring our work and approach is consistent with our values and best practice.

- 7. Excellent problem solving and decision-making skills.
- 8. Demonstratable commitment to CPD.
- 9. Ability to work as a team and independently.
- 10. Commitment to working in a flexible approach and an understanding of the working hours and demands of performance sport.
