

Job Title: Welsh for Adults & Language Skills Tutor

## **Core purpose of role**

The Welsh Language Unit at Cardiff Metropolitan University leads on the development and growth of Welsh medium provision and services for students, staff and the public across the University.

In support of the University's objectives of increasing Welsh medium provision and services, the Welsh Language Unit delivers a range of Welsh language learning and skill development programmes (from beginners to proficiency) to staff and students.

The post holder will be responsible for delivering Welsh for Adults programmes to students and staff across both of Cardiff Met's campuses and online, and for preparing Cardiff Met Students to undertake the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol's Welsh Language Skills Certificate (WLSC).

This role is funded by the National Centre for Learning Welsh and the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol, but the postholder will be a Cardiff Met member of staff.

## **Key responsibilities and contributions**

- Teach on Welsh for Adults programmes ranging from beginners to proficiency programmes.
- Help develop and launch new Welsh language learning and skill development programmes for students and staff.
- Deliver these programmes through a combination of face-to face and online delivery.
- Develop and prepare teaching resources as required, and tailor lessons to the needs of the learners within each class.
- Set appropriate assessments for each programme
- Work with the Welsh Language Unit in administering the programmes, including learner recruitment, registration, level assessment, and support/informal activities.
- Contribute to the Welsh Language Unit's programme of 'Informal Welsh' learning events and participate in the team's ongoing professional development activities.

- Ensure that Cardiff Met staff and students are aware of opportunities outside of the university to use and improve their Welsh.
- Coordinate the WLSC arrangements at the University: promoting the certificate, registering candidates, organising preparation sessions, organising oral assessments, written exams, etc.
- Provide workshops/preparation sessions for WLSC candidates.
- Attend WSC oral examination assessment training with the WJEC and the Chief Examiner, together with a briefing session before the written examination.
- Attend other meetings organised with officers from the Coleg Cymraeg to share good practice and give feedback on the WLSC.

### **Person specification**

- Educated to degree level or equivalent.
- Eligible to teach Welsh to adults under the 2002 Welsh for Adults regulations, i.e. Qualification to teach Welsh for Adults, or experience of teaching adults pre-2002, or an appropriate teaching qualification.

### **Essential experience, knowledge and skills**

1. Knowledge of Welsh for Adults programmes delivered in Wales.
2. Knowledge of effective pedagogy in delivering Welsh for Adults programmes.
3. Comprehensive knowledge of Welsh grammar.
4. Knowledge of the Welsh Language Skills certificate qualification.
5. Knowledge of delivering Welsh for Adults courses through e-learning.
6. Experience of delivering Welsh for Adults programmes, in both face-to-face and virtual settings.
7. Good organisational skills.
8. The ability to work effectively to deadlines.
9. The ability to work effectively as an individual and use your own initiative.
10. Good interpersonal skills.
11. Good IT skills, particularly in relation to the creation and delivery of teaching resources.
12. Ability to deliver Welsh for Adults programmes through e-learning methods.

### **Desirable**

1. Experience of delivering Welsh Language Certificate provision to students and coordinating examination arrangements.

2. A qualification in Welsh as a subject, O level, GCSE or a higher qualification.
3. Experience of working in the HE sector.
