Core purpose of role

The Open Campus Coordinator will collaborate with schools across Cardiff, particularly within the Southern Arc, to identify gaps in sport and physical activity provision and codesign tailored Open Campus activities and initiatives. As an integral member of the Active Young People team, the postholder will contribute to the Move More physical activity and sport strategy, driving opportunities for young people and local communities to engage in high-quality sport and physical activity.

They will connect service users, national governing bodies, and closely work with academic teams within Cardiff School of Sport & Health Sciences (CSSHS) to enrich the student experience by facilitating meaningful placement opportunities with Cardiff Met Sport.

Key Responsibilities and Contributions

- Lead the development and delivery of the Open Campus framework, including a varied programme of cross-curricular activities for participants and students that aligns with and contributes to the Move More physical activity and sport strategy.
- Coordinate the involvement of primary and secondary schools in Open Campus activities within curricular and external placements, ensuring strong links to the Move More strategy and its aims to increase participation in sport and physical activity across Cardiff.
- Deliver on agreed success measures to ensure positive participant and student experiences within the Open Campus programme.
- Line-manage the Open Campus placement students, ensuring the smooth and efficient day-to-day operation of programmes.
- Collaborate with Cardiff School of Sport and Health Sciences (CSSHS) to achieve key outcomes set by the Open Campus Steering Group.
- Strengthen partnerships with National Governing Bodies, schools and community groups to enhance the Open Campus experience for students.
- Foster effective relationships with internal stakeholders, including CSSHS, Cardiff Met Sport, and schools.



- Design and deliver programmes aligned with the Health and Wellbeing Area of Learning and Experience (AoLE), incorporating feedback from teachers and pupils to improve services.
- Integrate Open Campus placement students and projects into school initiatives to improve programme delivery and learning outcomes.
- Develop a Continuing Professional Development (CPD) programme for students to support learning and ensure high-quality delivery.
- Monitor and evaluate programme impact through data collection and analysis, producing quarterly learning logs for ongoing improvements.
- Act as a brand ambassador for Cardiff Met University, upholding university values and ensuring best practice in all activities.
